

Learning how to walk in our high kingdom calling is important when it comes to following Jesus, but so is learning to walk in our unique personal calling. This week we will dive in to discover what embracing our personal calling means.

Read Ephesians 4:1-3

We also read this passage last week, but it is important in helping us grasp the concept of the "walk" part of this series. If you read this passage in the ESV, Paul uses the word "walk" instead of the word live. So it reads "...to walk worthy of the calling with which you were called..."

Read Ephesians 2:10

What sticks out to you from this verse?

Does this verse change the way you view yourself? Does it change the way you view God?

Embracing our unique and personal calling is important. Paul explains why later in his letter.

Read Ephesians 4:11-16

How have you seen church leaders equip people to embrace and walk in their kingdom calling, as well as their personal calling?

In what ways does walking in your personal calling affect the community of believers?

What do you think it means to actually "speak the truth in love"?

Though God gives us church leaders and many other tools to help discover our kingdom calling as well as our unique calling, there is still a personal process each of us must submit to. Pastor Ben shared a quote with the church family by a guy named Frederick Buechner: "The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet."

Have you ever seen this at play in someone's life? What was it like to watch someone who was living in that place of deep gladness/deep hunger?

What do you think it would take to walk in your personal calling in a more full and robust way?

Father, thank you for weaving me together for a purpose. You have placed a unique call on my life, and I ask that you reveal it to me as I seek you.
